Take time to explore the downtown area. With several shops in a city block distance of each other, you are bound to find the perfect souvenir or treat-yourself gift. Built in 1792, be

sure to stop into the historic Courthouse and take a tour of the history museum and archives. If you are around in the summer or early fall, you may be able to catch a street festival or music event. Oh—and don't forget to take in the view of Douglas Lake from the dyke that saved Dandridge!

## DAY 3


