### **TOURISM INDUSTRY NEWS & UPDATES**

### **Tourism Advocacy and Legislative Update:**

- **SB0384/HB0405**: Requires hotel operators to remit the hotel tax to the municipality rather than issuing a credit or refund to a person who has maintained occupancy for 30 continuous days. <u>Link to Bill</u>
- **SB0629/HB0627**: Caption bill that includes several provisions, such as: a definition of tourism promotion & development, a hotel/motel tax cap, changes to municipality reporting requirements, and an exception for short-term rental tax collections. <u>Link to Bill Details</u>

**Hurricane Helene Cleanup**: Staff continues to work closely with TVA and TWRA to monitor Douglas Lake conditions and coordinate safety efforts during fishing tournaments. Staff attended the TVA interagency open house at Jefferson County High School on February 24th. As of February, over 30,000 cubic yards of debris had been collected, and as of March 31, debris removal is approximately 70% complete. More Info

**TN Hospitality & Tourism Association (TNHTA)**: Staff attended the first-quarter board meeting, held in Knoxville on January 21-22, and was appointed to the Defining Tourism Task Force for this legislative session.

**Middle East TN Tourism Council**: Staff attended the Annual METTC Legislator's Luncheon, which highlighted the economic impact of projects across the 16-county region that utilized tourism funds such as occupancy tax and grant programs. Tourism Director Lauren Hurdle received the 2024 Chuck Davis Tourism Leader of the Year award.

**Float the Mossy Project**: Staff has been working with local non-profit organizations to develop a new tourism asset and attraction in the Jefferson City historic district to designate Mossy Creek as a blue way and paddling destination. Tourism staff has assisted with the development of marketing and branding elements, advertising strategies, implementation, and grant consulting. The project will officially open on May 28, 2025. 

# LOCAL HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX

(July 2024 - February 2025)

- **2024/25 YTD**: \$586,845.76
- 6.1% decrease over Fiscal YTD 2023/24

The decreased revenue in the 2nd quarter is attributed to the impact from Hurricane Helene and the disruption of I-40 traffic from NC, SC, and GA. Inflation has also contributed to reduced lodging tax receipts nationwide.




### **PUBLIC RELATIONS & MARKETING**

- o Rescheduled due to Hurricane Helene Flooding
- o Over 630 Anglers participated in the three-day tournament
- o Anglers traveled from 13 different states, as far as Michigan and New Jersey
- o The big fish was a 5.2lb largemouth bass

### March 29 - Spirit of Nations Powwow, Jefferson County High School

- This longstanding event brought over 1,500 attendees
- o 288 people travelled from out of state
- o A total of 23% travelled greater than 75 miles.
